SCHOOL REGULATIONS

Discipline:

Students shall maintain an atmosphere that is conducive to learning and creating Islamic environment. Any act of misconduct, disrespect or disruption may be a cause for student warning, punishment (loss of free time, extra homework assignments, etc.), notification of parents or dismissal from the school.

Dress Code:

Children should abide by the school dress code that is outlined below:

1. All girls are strongly encouraged to wear their Hijab at all times.
2. Shorts are not allowed.
3. Any clothing materials displaying inappropriate images are not allowed.

Timings:

Tardy students are disruptive to the class, so it is important that student are punctual and be on time.

Attendance:

Attendance is very critical in order for progress to be achieved. Three or more consecutive absences require a meeting of the teacher and parent to discuss the situation.

RESPONSIBILITIES

Teacher Responsibilities:

- Record class attendance (first period instructor).
- Be 10 minutes earlier than students.
- Write down the homework assignments for the younger kids.
- Follow the class plan every week.
- Keep record for each child's grade and performance.
- Notify the principal ahead of time if not able to be present.

Student Responsibilities:

- Students should be on time.
- Students are expected to do their homework every week.
- Students are expected to be dressed in accordance with Islamic rules.

Parents Responsibilities:

- Parents will be required to follow up the work assigned to students, and help their children if needed.
- Parents should bring their kids on time.
- Parents should make sure student make up the missed lessons.
- Parents are expected to make sure that their child's folder is neat and organized.
